Nomination Periods	January 15, 2017 – March 15, 2017 (Strongly encouraged)	July 1, 2017 – August 25, 2017 (for partner schools that are not able to nominate students in Round 1)
Nomination Process	Nomination is made online. https://secure.students.ubc.ca/global/nominate.cfm . This form will be open for 2017/2018 nomination on January 15, 2017. Nomination tool will be closed outside the aforementioned periods and nominations made outside these two periods should be directly submitted to UBC Go Global via email, and will be reviewed on a case by case basis.

Application Process	Go Global will email the exchange online application URL directly to nominated students. Only nominated students should complete the online application.

Admission Process	Application files are reviewed by Go Global and/or faculties. Go Global sends Letter of Acceptance to partner schools as of mid-May / mid- October for Round 1 and Round 2 students respectively.	
Course Registration	July – August: registration for both Term 1 and Term 2 courses. November – December: Term 2 course registration for Round 2 students <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students who are nominated in Round 1 have the full range of courses to select. • Students who are nominated in Round 2 have limited selection of courses.

Language of Instruction	English	
Credit System and Course Load	A regular course load at UBC is 30 credits per academic year or 15 credits per semester. Most single term courses are a 3-credit course. The average UBC student takes 15 credits (5 courses) each term. Exchange students typically take between 9 and 15 credits per semester, depending on their degree requirements their home university. Students must maintain registration of minimum of 9 credits unless they are on an approved research exchange.

On-campus Housing	Limited number of rooms is reserved for exchange students. Due to high demand, on-campus housing for Term 1 exchange is not guaranteed even though priority is given to regular exchange students. Engineering CIE Term 1 exchange students do not qualify for Priority Access and we recommend CIE Term 1 only students look for off-campus housing because of the low chance of getting into a UBC residence.	Currently, the housing office in the Okanagan will prioritize all exchange applicants if they apply by the deadline. Term 2 students will be able to apply for housing in the fall semester.
Apply to Residence	Housing application can be done online at https://secure.housing.ubc.ca/ after exchange application is completed. There is a \$50 non-refundable application fee.	
Housing Placement	For Term 1 only students , priority is given to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students from partner schools that evenly distribute Term 1 and Term 2 nomination spots; • Students whose nomination is submitted during the regular nomination periods. Full year and Term 2 students have priority access. All residence offers are sent by email from Vancouver housing office and include an expiry date to respond and pay a deposit.	All residence offers are sent by email from Okanagan housing office and include an expiry date to respond and pay a deposit.



Immigration Requirements	
Canadian Entry Visa or Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA)	<p>A Temporary Resident Visa (TRV, “entry visa” or “visitor visa”) is required for students with certain citizenships to enter Canada. Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA) is required for foreign nationals from some visa-exempt countries. Study Permit	A study permit is required for all students who will be studying at UBC for more than 6 months. . Single-term students need to obtain a study permit if they intend to work on campus or want to extend their study to full-year.

Health Insurance & Student Services	
Medical Insurance (Mandatory Plan)	<p>Students staying less than 6 months (one term only): Single-term students are automatically covered under iMED (mandatory health insurance plan) for the duration of their exchange at UBC. The cost of iMED for one term students is \$252 CDN.</p> <p>Students staying for more than 6 months (full year or split-year students): Full year students are automatically covered by iMED for the first three months before they can be enrolled in BC Medical Services Plan (MSP), which is the basic medical insurance provided by BC government for anyone who will reside in BC for more than six months. The cost of iMED for full year students is \$180 CDN. The iMED plan will ensure that students have adequate medical coverage from the time they leave home (up to ten days prior to arrival if within the coverage dates) and while they are waiting for BC MSP to be effective.</p> <p>Full year and split-year students must apply for BC’s provincial Medical Services Plan (MSP) as soon as they arrive in BC, Canada. Orientation	Students will receive orientation initiation (Pre-arrival Webinar and International Welcome) though email with detailed information and schedule for September start or January start.
Recommended Arrival Dates	Term 1: first week of September; Term 2: first week of January It depends on housing move-in date and first day of class.
