Eligibility Requirements

- U.S. Citizen
- Undergraduate student in good academic standing
- Federal Pell Grant recipient
- Participating in a program abroad up to an academic year in length
- In the process of applying for, or accepted to, a credit-bearing study abroad or internship program in a country or area with an overall Travel Advisory Level 1 or 2, or select locations with a Travel Advisory Level 3, according to the U.S. Department of State Travel Advisory System

Award Amount

Successful applicants will receive a study grant of \$5,000 to be used toward tuition, housing, travel, and related costs for up to one academic year in Israel.

Application Deadline

First Tuesday of October: For programs that start December 1, 2022-October 31, 2023

First Tuesday of March: For programs that start March 1, 2022-April 30, 2023
