The Technion Graduate School awards the following degrees:

MSc | Master of Science

ME | Master of Engineering in non-research tracks

MBA | Master in Business Administration

PhD | Doctor of Philosophy

>> Studies for the Master Degree [brief summary]:

Registration and Admission: graduates of undergraduate degrees from accredited universities with a grade average (GPA) of at least 75% (in most departments admission requirements are higher). Some departments may require submission of GRE scores (Technion's code: 0343).

Applicants for an MBA degree are required to take the GMAT exam (Technion's code: 0027).

>> Studies for the Doctoral (PhD) Degree [brief summary]:

Registration and Admission: graduates of MSc/MA degrees (research track) from accredited universities, with a minimum score of 80 for the research work (most departments require a higher score) and a minimum GPA of 80 (higher in most departments). The GRE general test is required of all PhD applicants (Technion's code: 0343). Finding an advisor prior to registration is a prerequisite.

Study Requirements: coursework, candidacy exam, research, giving a seminar lecture, writing and defense of a thesis. Departments may have additional requirements.

>> Language of Studies at Technion

By default, classes at the Technion are conducted in Hebrew, therefore basic knowledge of Hebrew is recommended. However, all Technion departments have committed to teaching **graduate level** courses in English, under some conditions, following a request by an international student per a specific course.

>>> Language Requirement

Technion graduate students must have a good knowledge of English, therefor all graduate students are required to pass the "English Proficiency Examination" in the first semester of their studies.

An exemption from the exam is granted to:

- > PhD's
- > a student with a score of 75% and higher in the language portion of the GRE/GMAT
- > Graduates of a high school or accredited academic institutions in which the language of instruction is English

All PhD students are required to take the "Academic English Writing" course.

>>> Scholarships:

Scholarships are available for M.Sc. (research track) and PhD students with high academic achievements. Scholarships are awarded in portions (1-6) of different amount for M.Sc. and PhD students. Currently they range from 240-300\$ per portion. Scholarships carry a full or partial tuition waiver and are awarded for a period of 24 months for M.Sc. students and 42-48 months for PhD students (depending on the field of studies).

>>> Housing:

On Campus: dormitories for singles, couples and families are on an availability basis for research track students with a full scholarship only. Eligibility is based on academic achievements and availability.

Off Campus: You may look for rental apartments in neighborhoods surrounding the campus for approx. 500-800\$ for two-bedroom apartment.

>>> Deadlines for Registration:

Fall Semester: **February - 1 April** / Spring Semester: **October - 1 November** Registration to PhD studies is available all year long. However, the registration dates for dormitories are as mentioned above .
